

E. Sanders Burwood Stores



Built in the early 1870s, Edward Sanders, conducted a general store business, pictured above, at the south-western corner of Burwood Road and Livingstone Street. The store provided the services of house, land and estate agents, which would account for newspaper advertisements in *The Sydney Morning Herald* between 1875 and 1880 for tradesmen, painter, carpenters and joiners to work on three cottages including a tender for 25,000 bricks.

The store also provided a servants registry office, which perhaps explains the advertisement in *The Sydney Morning Herald* on 25 September, 1873, pictured below.

Edward Sanders J.P. died on 15 July 1911 at his residence, 'Carshalton', Livingstone Street, Burwood, aged 79 years. He was a resident of Burwood for 43 years and actively involved in its development. He was a member of the first school board, alderman for many years and Mayor for 1885. At the time of his death his son Edward E. Sanders was the Mayor of Burwood.
